2009 Activities Report

Wetland Conservation Act

The Isanti Conservation District assists cities, townships, citizens, and County departments in the administration of the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act. District staff provides technical and administrative assistance for wetland related activities throughout Isanti County. Common activities involved with the program include ponds, driveways, developments and wetland banking. The District has continued its commitment to ensure that staff is adequately trained and updated on current wetland rules and policy. In 2009, District staff worked on 34 wetland permit requests.

District Tree Program

The Isanti Conservation District offered for sale tree and shrub species native to Minnesota. Producers purchased the trees to plant into windbreaks, urban and rural conservation and wildlife food and habitat. Through the annual tree program the District is able to promote conservation practices and the value of forestry resources in preventing soil loss and improving water quality. The District sold over 56,000 trees in 2009 and planted 3000 trees for windbreaks.

Cost-Share Program

Provided \$55,000 in Native Buffer Cost-Share funding for Isanti County Parks to establish and/or maintain restored native prairie and restored prairie using seeds of the local ecotype.

Cost share assistance in the amount of \$13,181.00 was also used for a stream bank erosion control projects in Isanti County.

District No-Till Seeding Program

Provided seeding for the following:

1. Alfalfa seeding----160 acres
2. No-till Soybeans—800 acres
3. Native Prairie Grasses—500 acres

Groundwater and Precipitation Monitoring Program

1. Water quality monitoring 3 sites on Rum River
2. Ground water monitoring of 5 wells throughout Isanti County
3. 8 precipitation recording sites in Isanti County
