Isanti Soil and Water Conservation District **2012 Activities Report**

Wetland Conservation Act

The Isanti Soil and Water District assists cities, townships, citizens, and County departments in the administration of the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act. District staff provides technical and administrative assistance for wetland related activities throughout Isanti County. Common activities involved with the program include ponds, driveways, developments and wetland banking. The District has continued its commitment to ensure that staff is adequately trained and updated on current wetland rules and policy.

District Tree Program

The Isanti Soil and Water Conservation District offered for sale tree and shrub species native to Minnesota. Producers purchased the trees to plant into windbreaks, urban and rural conservation and wildlife food and habitat. Through the annual tree program the District is able to promote conservation practices and the value of forestry resources in preventing soil loss and improving water quality. The District sold over 30,000 trees in 2012.

Cost-Share Program

The District received funds from the State Cost Share Program to complete the following practices: Provided Cost-Share funding for Isanti County Parks for critical area planting to establish and/or maintain restored native prairie and restored prairie using seeds of the local ecotype.

District No-Till Seeding Program

Provided seeding for the following:

1. Alfalfa seeding----60 acres
2. No-till Soybeans—600 acres
3. Native Prairie Grasses—250 acres

Groundwater and Precipitation Monitoring Program

1. Ground water monitoring of 5 wells throughout Isanti County
2. The SWCD has 8 precipitation recorders throughout Isanti County. Working with the State Climatology office, the data collected provides citizens and the State of Minnesota with important precipitation information and weather history.
